Purpose and Legal Basis of Data Processing

Your data will be processed for the purpose of selecting participants for the summer school and, in the event of your application being successful, subsequently for conducting the summer school. The legal basis for processing is the execution of pre-contractual measures or the fulfilment of the contract concluded with you upon participation in the summer school.

Legal Basis for Data Processing

The Studienstiftung processes your data on the basis of Article 6(1)(b) GDPR (for the performance of a contract or pre-contractual measures).

Categories of Personal Data

Name, gender, date of birth, nationality, address, email address, current educational status, date of graduation (if applicable), course of study, university you have attended, motivation for attendance.

Recipients or Categories of Recipients

We have concluded a data processing agreement with Limesurvey GmbH; they will process your data as part of the questionnaire.

Duration of Data Retention

If your application is unsuccessful, your data will be deleted six months after the rejection has been sent. If your application is successful, we will require your data for the performance of the contract / your participation in the summer school. Even after the conclusion of the contract, it may be necessary to retain personal data of the contractual partner to fulfil contractual or legal obligations.

Your Rights

You have the right to know what data we store about you and for what purpose (right of access), to have that data corrected (right to rectification), or to request its deletion (right to

erasure). Under certain circumstances, you also have the right to object to the processing of your data (right to object).

Additionally, you have the right to file a complaint with a supervisory authority.
